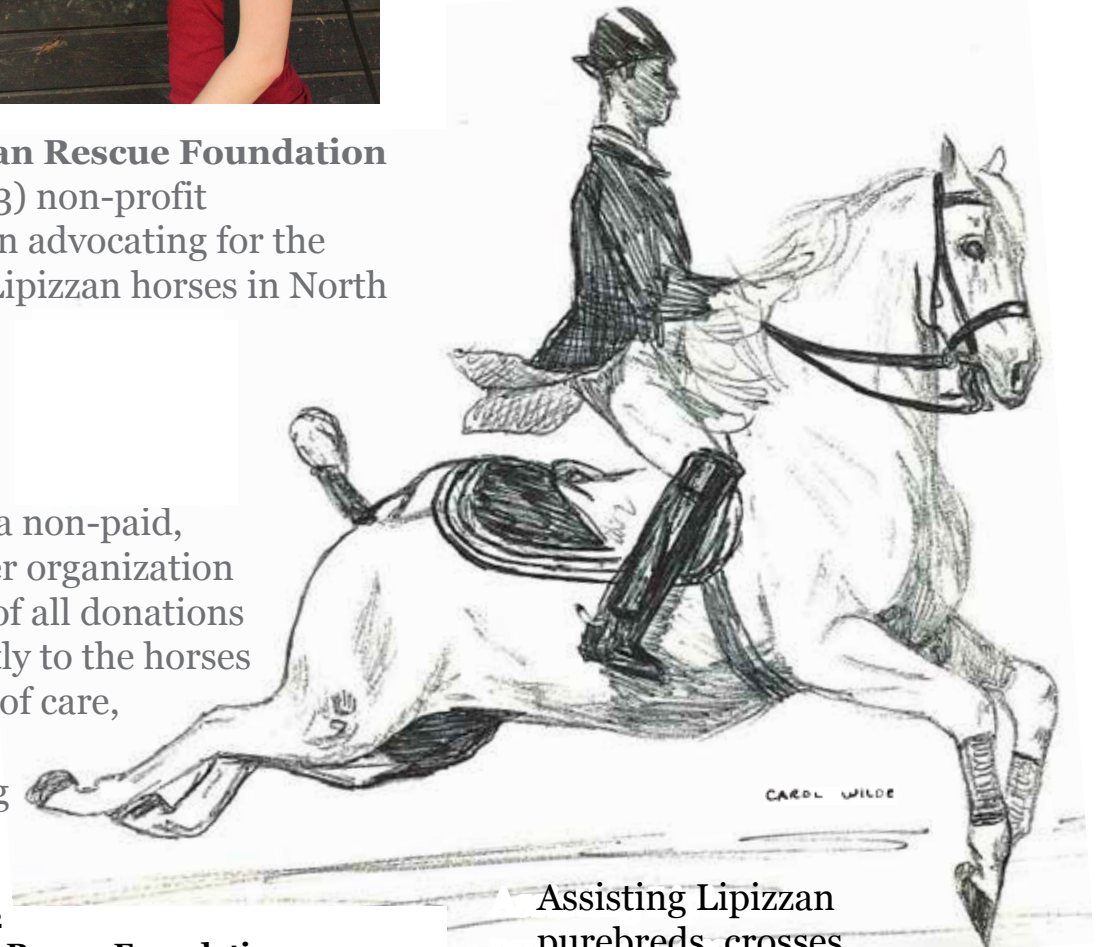


The Lipizzan Rescue Foundation is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization advocating for the welfare of Lipizzan horses in North America.

A primary role of the LRF since its creation in 2009 is to discretely, and carefully, match adoptable horses to forever homes.

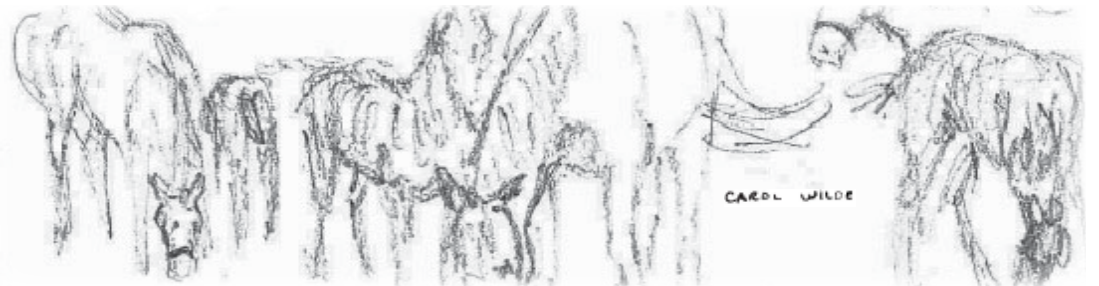


The Lipizzan, dating from 1580, is one of the oldest European horse breeds. Lipizzans were originally bred for strength, hardiness, temperament, endurance, and longevity for military purposes as well as for nobility.

For over 450 years, the Spanish Riding School of Vienna's Lipizzan stallions have been the top representatives of classical dressage training and riding in the world.



Modern Lipizzans, with their high intelligence, loyalty, and athleticism, are now found in private hands. The breed's timeless characteristics make the Lipizzan an ideal choice for any type of equestrian activity.



Current estimates for registered purebred Lipizzans in North America are 1,000, with around 300 registered partbreds.

In spite of being a rare breed, Lipizzans and their owners in North America are not immune from finding themselves in times of need.
